- Generating and customising QR-codes




Recommended tools

Extra benefit

The accessibility of the QR-code labels outside of lessons encourages additional usage. They can be expanded, adapted, and updated at any time. A virtual tour is transferable to other situations such as: a guided tour through the school or the farm.





Step 1

Step 2

Choose the most relevant facts about this variety. You can prepare either a short text or record a short video clip presenting the variety with ampelographic information.




Step 3

Generate a QR-code with a QR generator. Create one code per variety. You can also include your logo or a picture of the variety in the QR-code.

Step 4

Make waterproof nametags with these QR codes. Add the national flags and label the vines in the European vineyard.
